Expectations of Candidate Dispositions

All teacher candidates will be provided with the disposition forms during their coursework in the College of Education. Dispositions expected for those in initial programs will be discussed in EDUC 2100/5500 or equivalent course, published in appropriate teacher education documents, and reinforced throughout the program. Candidates in advanced programswill be provided a form outlining the expected dispositions in their first graduate course. Candidates will be made aware that repeated violations of these dispositions will constitute grounds for the filing of negative disposition forms and the resulting consequences.

edTPA (Educative Teacher Performance Assessment)

The edTPA is a preservice assessment process designed by educators to answer the essential question: "Is a new teacher ready for the job?" The edTPA is designed to measure teacher candidate effectiveness in the classroom by focusing on student learning. edTPA is comprised of three tasks: Planning, Instruction, and Assessment. Each task is broken into five sections measured by a specific rubric, and scored by nationally certified scorers. Austin Peay's College of Education has incorporated the edTPA preparation program throughout the education curriculum to prepare students to excel in the edTPA assessment and the classroom.
