2. Applied Behavioral Analysis Certificate

3. 6-8 Middle Grades (Science) concentration in BS Education
 - Removing the PSYC 3200 (Adolescent Development) course from requirements.
 - Adding a PHYS option of 1020 (Concepts: Electromagnetism, Light, and the Quantum World), 1021 (Concepts: Electromagnetism, Light, and the Quantum World) or 1710 (Introduction to Chemistry and Physics).
4. 6-8 Middle School (Social Studies) concentration in BS Education
 - Removing the PSYC 3200 (Adolescent Development) course from the requirements.
 - Making ECON 2000 (Contemporary Economics) and or option with ECON 2100 (Principles of Macroeconomics).
 - Clarification in the language for the Concentration Guided Electives section.
5. 6-8 Middle School (Math) concentration in BS Education
 - Removing the PSYC 3200 (Adolescent Development) course from the requirements.
 - Adding in an option of complete one from MATH 4321 (Introduction to Data Analysis and Programming), CSCI 1005 (Introduction to Information Technology), CSCI 1010 (Introduction to Programming I) and 1011 (Introduction to Programming I Lab) or CSCI 2000 (Programming for STEM).

Benita Bruster grouped items 3 – 5 together. She explained that all of these programs were removing the PSYC 3200 and adding another appropriate course option for that are of study that will assist with meeting the licensure needs.

Maria Cronley asked if the departments involved are aware of the changes? Benita Bruster explained that she was not sure but would assume this had been discussed and would double check.

Maria Cronley also asked if they why the PSYC 3200 was being removed? Benita Bruster explained that as the state was changing the licensure requirements there just wasn't enough room to keep all of the courses and remain within the constraints of the number of credit hours required for degree completion. The PSYC 3200 content is covered across other courses.

Manisha Gupte asked why there was not an Introduction to Biology course in this? Benita explained the Biology is in other places just not replacing the PSYC 3200 requirement.
