Program Overview

Study the archaeology of ancient Greece and the language of modern Greece while visiting sites ranging from the Neolithic period to the modern period. Highlights include hiking the Samaria Gorge on Crete and staying in restored 19th century homes in Arachova, where you can get a first-hand lesson in Greek cooking.

General Itinerary*

You'll spend the first two weeks in the city of Chania on the north coast of Crete. Next is a three-day tour of Crete's sites and museums. After a ferry ride to the mainland, you'll spend time on the road, visiting sites in the Argolid, Olympia, Delphi and central Greece. You will spend your final four days in and around Athens.

You will reside in a double-occupancy hotel room. Depending on the number of students, you may reside in a triple-occupancy hotel room on occasion. Breakfast and dinner are included.
