

President's Cabinet
Minutes
November 10, 2008

The Cabinet met on November 10 at 9:00 a.m. Present were: Byrd, Clark, Denton, Drew, Gregory, Hall, Henry, Jackson, Loos, McMillan, McQueen, Mulkeen, Robinson, and Struckmeyer.

- Hall reported that Fall II enrollment at Fort Campbell is up by 20 percent. The final enrollment report will be given to Hall by the end of this week. Total enrollment for Fort Campbell and main campus is 9,401. This is a 3.3% increase. Hall asked Mulkeen to check on the enrollments from other schools in the state to see if we can still say that APSU is the fastest growing university in the state, not just the TBR system. He also asked Mulkeen to give him a report on the distribution of hours that APSU students are registered for Fall 2008.
- Hall stated that we have begun marketing the summer session for student registration. Denton stated one of the reasons summer session numbers are down may be due to the lack of financial aid offered during the summer.
- Hall stated that the TBR will be discussing the state's financial situation in the upcoming days and how higher education can be better prepared for future financial challenges. APSU will be working on a plan to budget for these future challenges. Hall stated that he is considering setting up a permanent budget committee next year.
- Hall thanked the cabinet for meeting with the provost candidates and encouraged everyone to turn in their evaluation forms to Dr. Michele Butts by this afternoon.
- Hall asked about the process of students dropping classes and falling below full-time status. He stated that students should be made well aware that this decision may affect their financial aid. McQueen will talk with Anna Murray in Information Technology to see if any further steps can be placed on the system to warn students against dropping below full-time status and the consequences thereof.

The meeting adjourned at 10:15 a.m. The next cabinet meeting will be on Monday, November 24, at 9:00 in the Iris Room.
