These hours must include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ 8 hours of science from Biol 2010,2020, and/or 2300 plus labs ▪ 6 hours nursing pre-requisites from Psy 1010,3100,Soc 2010, and/or Math 1530 ▪ 16 hours of APSU core from Eng 1010,1020,2030,Hist 2010, 2020, Humanities 6 hrs, and/or Comm1010 ▪ APSU 1000 (not required for transfer students with > 12 hrs) ▪ have a documented plan for completion of remaining core and pre-requisite courses prior to starting nursing courses. ▪ have completed all pre-requisite Biology courses within seven (7) years of the time of application. ▪ have cleared any high school deficiencies. ▪ meet core performance and professional (technical) standards.
