Unapproved minutes of meeting held April 28, 2009

The minutes from March 24, 2009 were approved unanimously

09-018: The Effects of mentoring on the retention of non-cognitive-at-risk, first-time, full-time freshmen. Action was deferred until the called meeting on May 6, 2009. Sheila Pirkle agreed to work with the PI on a number of issues raised by IRB members.

09-004: The ethical views of business leaders, university faculty, and students in the United States. Action was deferred until the called meeting on May 6, 2009. PI had communicated that additional revisions to the proposal were coming.

09-012: The effects of preparatory imagery on anxiety in collegiate track and field athletes. Motion to approve failed (for 1; against 11). The researcher will be invited to submit a revised proposal.

09-013: HIV/AIDS public service announcements awareness among African American women in Middle Tennessee. Motion to approve failed (for 0; against 12). The researcher will be invited to submit a revised proposal.

09-016: Visual and vestibular function in soldiers with traumatic brain injury. Motion to approve with the following pending the receipt of a letter from the appropriate military office citing support and cooperation with the project was supported unanimously.

09-017: How the daily work activities of school counselors align with the ASCA's national model. Action deferred until called meeting on May 6, 2009.

09-019: Evaluation of the effectiveness of the Title III Promoting Academic Student Success Program (PASS) in improving the academic performance and retention of student participants. Motion to approve pending the following change was unanimously supported.

- Inclusion of a statement on the consent form that participants can withdraw at anytime from the study without penalty.

09-020: Mobil phones and fashion: A new self-identity. Action deferred until called meeting on May 6, 2009.

09-021: Development of entrepreneurship education in America and its application to Taiwan's technological and vocational education. Action deferred until called meeting on May 6, 2009.
