



OX-EYE DAISY

Chrysanthemum leucanthemum L.

Heads of white and brownish flowers give this plant its common name. A relative of the well-known cultivated forms, this European native is beautiful in itself. Plants may be more than two feet in height and usually grow in dense clumps. Leaves are alternate and may be coarsely toothed or divided. Regarded by many as a weed, the Ox-Eye may be found in abundance on roadsides, in open fields, and in other disturbed areas. Look for flowers from May-autumn (**Asteraceae**, the Aster Family).
