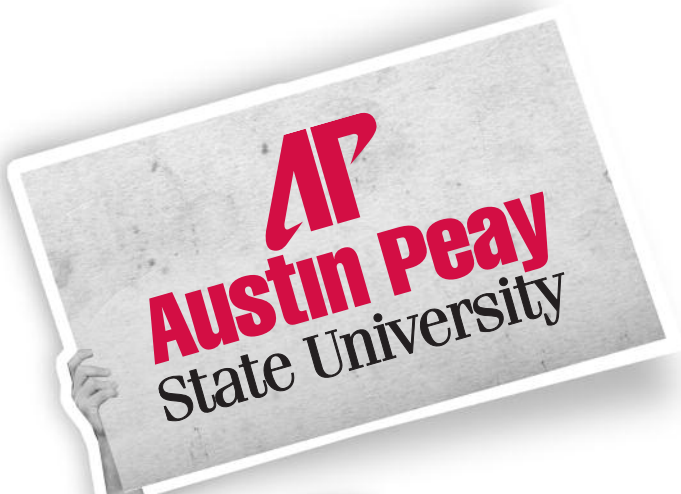

Welcome to Austin Peay State University! By now, you have come to realize that Austin Peay is a wonderful place to further your education. We, at the Office of Admissions, want to make the application process as easy and enjoyable as possible.

The application fee is waived for active duty military. Transcripts from all previously attended institutions should be sent directly from that institution to the APSU Office of Admissions. Hand-delivered transcripts will not be accepted. All required information must be received before acceptance, evaluation of transfer credit or registration can take place.

All applicants will be required to meet the following set of guidelines for admission. Freshman applicants will be placed in one of four admissions categories.

FOUR FRESHMEN ADMISSIONS CATEGORIES

Full (Unconditional) Admission

Applicants who satisfactorily meet the following requirements may achieve full unconditional admission to Austin Peay State University:

YOUNGER THAN 21 YEARS OF AGE (AT THE TIME OF ENROLLMENT)

- *One of the following assessments is required.*
 - ACT composite score of 20 or greater and proof of high school graduation.
 - SAT composite score of 940 or greater (Critical Reading and Math) and proof of high school graduation.
 - High school cumulative GPA of 2.85 or greater (on a 4.0 scale) and proof of high school graduation.

- GED score of 450 or greater (45 prior to January 2002) with a passing notation and ACT composite score of 20 or greater or SAT composite score of 940 or greater.
- *Plus one of the following:*
 - Meet all 14 high school unit requirements.
 - ACT composite score of 26 or greater.
 - SAT composite score of 1170 or greater (Critical Reading and Math).
- *In addition, applicants must have*
 - No more than one ACT subscore of 18 or less in English and Math.
 - No more than one SAT subscore of 450 or less in Critical Reading and Math.

21 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER (AT THE TIME OF ENROLLMENT)

- *One of the following is required.*
 - Proof of high school graduation (excluding a Special Education Diploma)
 - GED score of 450 or greater (45 prior to January 2002) with a passing notation.
- COMPASS assessment requiring placement in no more than one enhanced core course.

Conditional Admission

Applicants who do not meet full admission requirements may achieve conditional admission to APSU by satisfactorily meeting the following requirements:

YOUNGER THAN 21 YEARS OF AGE (AT THE TIME OF ENROLLMENT)

- *Meet all 14 high school unit requirements.*
- *Plus one of the following assessments:*
 - ACT composite score of 19 or greater and proof of high school graduation.
 - SAT composite score of 900 or greater (Critical Reading and Math) and proof of high school graduation.
 - High school cumulative GPA of 2.75 or greater (on a 4.0 scale) and proof of high school graduation.

- GED score of 450 (45 prior to January 2002) with a passing notation and ACT composite score of 20 or greater or SAT composite score of 940 or greater.
- *In addition, one of the following:*
 - More than one ACT subscore of 18 or less in English and Math, requiring enrollment in enhanced core mathematics and English.
 - More than one SAT subscore of 450 or less in Critical Reading and Math, requiring enrollment in enhanced core mathematics and English.

21 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER (AT THE TIME OF ENROLLMENT)

- *COMPASS assessment requiring placement in two or more enhanced core courses.*
- *Plus one of the following:*
 - Proof of high school graduation (excluding Special Education diploma).
 - GED score of 450 or greater (45 prior to January 2002) with a passing notation.

The stipulations of the conditional admission category will be outlined in the decision letter.

Admission by Exception

(Younger than 21 years of age only)

Applicants who do not satisfactorily meet all 14 required high school units may achieve admission by exception to APSU by satisfactorily meeting the following requirements:

- *One of the following:*
 - ACT composite score of 21 or greater.
 - SAT composite score of 980 or greater.
 - High school cumulative GPA of 3.0 or greater (on a 4.0 scale).
 - GED score of 450 (45 prior to January 2002) with a passing notation and ACT cumulative score of 21 or greater or SAT composite score of 980 or greater.
- *No more than two high school unit deficiencies.*
- *No more than one placement in an enhanced core course.*

Admission by Alternative Standards

(Younger than 21 years of age only)

Freshman applicants younger than 21 years of age who meet no other category of admission but have special abilities or circumstances that merit consideration in the admissions process may achieve

admission by alternative standards.

Written formal appeals of the University's admissions decisions may be filed with the Office of Admissions. To appeal an admission decision, applicants shall include all the following:

1. Admissions Decision Appeal Form (available from the Office of Admissions or <http://www.apsu.edu/admissions/>).
2. At least two letters of recommendation from academic professionals (teacher, professor, academic adviser, guidance counselor, principal, etc.) who are familiar with the applicant's academic abilities. These letters must be on school letterhead, must be signed and must include contact information for the letter's author.
3. At the applicant's prerogative, additional information may be provided, such as personal statements, advocacy letters, etc.

The aforementioned information will be reviewed by the University Admissions and Standards Committee. The outcome of an admission decision appeal is determined based on the applicant's expected ability to succeed academically at APSU. Applicants admitted via the appeal process are conditionally admitted. Appeal decisions will be sent to applicants via post mail.

The stipulations of this admissions category will be outlined in the decision letter.

Transfer Applicants

Transfer applicants must be in good academic standing with (not suspended from) the last institution attended, among other requirements. Applicants are in good standing as long as their grade-point average is equal to or greater than the minimum listed below:

QUALITY HOURS ATTEMPTED	MINIMUM GRADE- POINT AVERAGE
12 – 29	1.50
30 – 45	1.80
46 – 59	1.90
60 and greater	2.00

Transfer applicants having attempted fewer than 12 quality hours at another college or university are considered for admission based on Freshman Applicant admissions criteria. Policies on the transferability of credits may be found in the Academic Policies section of the University Bulletin.

All transfer students must submit the following:

- Official transcript(s) from **all** previous colleges/universities attended must be sent directly from the previously attended institution to the APSU Office of Admissions, regardless of credit received.
- Evidence of high school graduation through an official high school transcript mailed directly from the high school of graduation to the Office of Admissions, or an External Diploma Program or a minimum GED score of 450 (45 prior to 2002) and no subscore less than 410 (40 prior to January 2002). Special education diplomas or high school certificates of attendance are not acceptable. The exception to this requirement is for students who graduate from high school or receive a GED prior to 1989.

Applicants from Nonpublic High Schools

Applicants who graduated from nonpublic high schools (including private schools, home schools, church-related schools, etc.) must submit an official transcript showing credits earned and date of graduation. Transcripts of home school applicants must be an official copy from an affiliated organization as defined by state law (T.C.A. 49-50-801) or be accompanied by a certification of registration with the superintendent of the local education agency which the student otherwise would have attended.

Applicants who cannot provide a satisfactory secondary school credential may substitute with acceptable scores from a GED examination.

International Applicants

All international applicants must file their applications and submit certified copies of official transcripts, certificates, diplomas and degrees translated to English well in advance of the semester for which they seek admission. Transfer applicants from foreign institutions also must provide a course-by-course equivalency performed by an educational credential agency. The Office of Admissions handles application procedures for undergraduate international students. Readmission Applicants

Applicants seeking readmission to APSU main campus must resubmit an application for admission if they have missed one semester (excluding summer) and submit every transcript from all institutions attended since last attending APSU, regardless of whether credit was earned. Students wishing to apply for readmission to Austin Peay Center @ Fort Campbell must resubmit an application after missing two terms and must submit every transcript from all institutions attended since last attending APSU, regardless of whether credit was earned.

Immunizations

The state of Tennessee requires all new and readmitted full-time students to provide proof of two immunizations with the Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccines, which were administered on or after the first year of birth. A student will not be allowed to register for classes until this requirement is met. For additional information, contact Boyd Health Services at (931) 221-7107.

First-Time-In-College Applicants

Applicants must present evidence of graduation of high school, an External Diploma Program (EDP) completion certificate or a minimum GED score of 450 (45 prior to January 2002). A Special Education Diploma or High School Certificate is not acceptable. Transcripts of graduates from Tennessee public high schools must include a notation indicating that the student has passed the required Proficiency Examination or Gateway Examination. All first-time freshman applicants, younger than 21 years of age, except for active duty military, are required to submit official scores from the ACT or SAT examination. All first-time freshman applicants, 21 years of age or older, except for active duty military, must submit COMPASS assessment scores, prior to admission.

College Credit For ACT/SAT English Subscores

Applicants who have an ACT English subscore of 28 to 30 (620-680 SAT) will receive academic credit for English 1010. Those who have a valid ACT English subscore of 31 to 36 (690-800 SAT) will receive academic credit for English 1010 and 1020. Such credit, if applicable, will be applied to the student's academic record after the completion of his/her first fall or spring semester.

Required Military Documents

Military (both active duty and veterans) are required to submit documents for military credit prior to enrollment. The following documents should be sent to the Office of Admissions directly from the issuing agency (except for form DD 214).

Scholarship Information

Austin Peay State University awards numerous scholarships based on academic merit, special talents and/or accomplishments.

To be considered for the most scholarships possible, applicants must complete an admission application and a separate scholarship application as soon as possible. You may access the online scholarship application and further scholarship information at www.apsu.edu/scholarships.

Please read the individual scholarship descriptions carefully as some scholarships require letters of recommendation, auditions and/or portfolios.

- **Presidential Scholarship** - These competitive scholarships are available to high school seniors who have a minimum ACT composite score of 25 (1130 SAT), a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) and demonstrated leadership ability. Award amounts vary from \$500 - \$6,000 per year.
- **Howell C. Smith Jr. and Sr. Adult Learner Scholarship** - These competitive scholarships are available to students who are ages 24 and older and are new to APSU. Applicants must complete a scholarship application, an admissions application and the FAFSA form. Recipients will have some financial need and enroll in at least six hours with APSU. One-time award amount is \$1,000 per year.
- **Howell C. Smith Jr. and Sr. Freshman Scholarship** - These competitive scholarships are available to high school seniors who have a minimum ACT composite score of 21 (980 SAT), a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) and demonstrated leadership ability. One-time award amount is \$1,000 per year.
- **Honors Program Scholarship** - These supplemental scholarships are available to freshmen applicants enrolling in the Honors Program who have a minimum ACT composite score of 28 (1250 SAT) and a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale). Award amount is \$500 and may be added to other scholarships, up to the University limit.
- **Leadership (President's Emerging Leaders Program) Scholarship** - These supplemental scholarships are available to freshmen applicants accepted into the President's Emerging Leaders Program (PELP). PELP applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5 and an ACT composite score of 24 (1090 SAT) and show evidence of participation in high school and community activities, thus demonstrating leadership potential. Three letters of reference are required (one from an academic individual and one from a community resource). An on-campus interview, at the expense of the applicant, is required. Award amount is \$3,000 per year.
- **Community College Scholarship** - These competitive scholarships are available to new transfer students from a Tennessee community college or Hopkinsville (Ky.) Community College, who have completed an associate degree or have achieved a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 with at least 12 hours. Award amounts vary.
- **Alumni, General and Private Scholarships (Open)** - A limited number of private scholarships funded by various alumni and donors are available. Financial need, cumulative GPA, standardized test scores and/or other qualifications, specified by the donor, are considered. Award amounts vary.
- **Performance/Departmental Scholarships** - Departmental performance scholarships are awarded to students who excel in art, music, communication, theater, creative writing and student publication. Auditions and/or portfolios may be required. Please contact the appropriate department for further information. Also, many academic departments have private scholarships that have been created specifically for those departments. Award amounts vary.

All scholarships are extremely competitive and may be awarded before or after any stated deadline on a first-come, first-served basis. Due to limited funding, early completion of admissions applications and scholarship applications is strongly encouraged. Meeting stated eligibility criteria does not guarantee receipt of a scholarship. Austin Peay State University reserves the right to cancel or change the amount, eligibility criteria and/or deadline of certain scholarships.
