



A Special Note for Parents

We know that in today's world, safety is your No. 1 concern. Rest assured, Austin Peay is one of the safest campuses in the country. We've taken numerous steps to ensure our students' safety.

- Only residents and approved University personnel have access to residence halls. Students residing in halls that have interior room entrances must swipe their I.D. card to enter the residence hall. In residence halls that have exterior room entrances, students must swipe their I.D. card to enter the lobby and laundry areas.
- Doors to all rooms and apartments have peepholes, allowing students to see visitors before letting them enter.
- Austin Peay's campus police officers continually patrol the campus by car, motorcycle, bicycle and on foot. Upon request, officers will escort students from classrooms, the library or other campus facilities to their rooms after nightfall.
- Housing personnel are on call from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. for assistance.

No matter what living arrangement you're looking for, chances are Austin Peay offers it.

The University offers on-campus housing for more than 1,450 students, and the options run the gamut, from rooms for one to suite-style living for four.

Private rooms are designed for residents who like their privacy. Each room has only one bed and, with the exception of rooms in Miller Hall, bathrooms are shared by only one other resident.

Suite-style residential halls house four people. Each bedroom in the unit has two twin beds. All residents share a bathroom.

Nontraditional student housing features one-bedroom apartments exclusively for graduate students or students age 23 or older who have no children.

Family housing, with one- to three-bedroom apartments, is perfect for married couples with or without children.

ADA housing is for students with physical disabilities. These rooms meet all Americans with Disabilities Act regulations.

Special housing options

Learning community. The Hand Village Learning Community is designed for students dedicated to academic success. Freshman residents of Hand Village buildings 300 and 400 participate in activities and programs designed to help them succeed during their first year at APSU.

To participate, request Hand Village on your housing application and ask to be part of the Hand Village Learning Community. Assignments are made on a first-come, first-served basis.

Smoke-free halls. All residence halls and apartment complexes are designated as smoke-free.

Honors halls. In Blount and Harvill halls, you can reside with students who share your high academic standards. Open to students with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0 and no formal disciplinary record, these halls are especially convenient to the library and center of campus.

Super singles. Have a lot of stuff? Or just need your space? Available only in Cross Hall and Miller Hall, Super Singles are double-occupancy rooms that have been converted into housing for one. You can settle in and spread out.

Stay over winter break!

Don't want to pack up and move out for winter break? You don't have to! Our residence halls remain open throughout winter break so you can continue enjoying the comforts of your campus home.

Pick up your laundry!

Every residence hall and apartment complex on campus has a fully-equipped laundry room, and use of the washers and dryers is **free** for campus residents. You can save your quarters for the snack machines!

Pick up something to eat!

At Austin Peay, you won't have to worry about where you'll get your next meal. The University offers a wide variety of flexible dining options.

You can eat what you want with a meal plan at the **APSU Café**, our all-you-can-eat restaurant located in Morgan University Center (MUC). Through your meal plan, you'll reserve a specific number of meals on a weekly or semester basis.

Of course, you won't have to eat all your meals at the Café. Every meal plan comes with a **meal exchange** feature that will allow you to swap a meal at the APSU Café for an allowance at one of our other dining locations. Your meal plan also will include **Plus Dollars** that can be used at any dining location.

In the **Food Court**, you'll find concepts like Chick-fil-a, Mama Leone's, Habaneros, Wrapables, Freshens Smoothies and more. Just around the corner, **Einstein Bros. Bagels** offers all the comforts of a coffee house plus sandwiches and salads.

Still not enough variety for you? In the Sundquist Science Complex, you can buy drinks, sandwiches and treats at the **Sundquist Kiosk**. If you're craving burgers, shakes and a 1950s atmosphere, **Austin's Diner** is open until midnight. There's even a convenience store – the **Peay Pod** – on the first floor of the MUC.

The nuts and bolts of APSU housing

Room assignments. Residence hall assignments are based on the date prepayments and applications are received. So the sooner you apply, the better!

If you have a roommate preference, you and your preferred roommate should submit your housing applications together and list each other as roommates by name and student I.D. number in the space provided on the application. Be sure you both meet the requirements for the requested residence hall or apartment.

Rooms for one. A limited number of private rooms are available, and assignments are made on a first-come, first-served basis. Applied too late to get one? You get a second chance during Great Change Day, normally held the third week of the term. (See the next section for more information.)

Room changes. If you're simply not happy with your room assignment, you might be able to switch. You'll just need to wait for Great Change Day. Typically held during the third week of classes, Great Change Day gives residents a chance to opt out of a less-than-ideal living situation or get a private room. Remember, all requests are handled on a first-come, first-served basis.

Room rates. Housing costs are subject to change, so please call the Housing Office at (931) 221-7444 for the latest information on rates, or check the Web site at www.apsu.edu/housing. If you'd like to pay for your housing through an installment plan, contact the Business Office at (931) 221-7667.
