
The Great Sexuation


TPHA Conference: Sept. 28-30



APSU Professional Spotlight : Nia Gibbs-Francis

Hello, Austin Peay Public Health Students! My name is Nia Gibbs-Francis, and I am a proud alumnus of the Public Health Program. Currently I am using my public health degree in my work as a Site Compliance Reviewer for the Center for Disease Control Foundation working in conjunction with the Maryland Department of Health. I am a member of an emergency response team whose job is to ensure that the COVID-19 vaccines are being properly prepared, stored, and administered. I meet with various providers throughout the state of Maryland and work with them to ensure that they meet standards of compliance. If we find there has been an issue with compliance and standards of preparation, storage, and administration an investigation must be launched, patients must be contacted and re-vaccinated, all shipments to the provider must halt, and we work with the provider to ensure they complete corrective actions.

My advice for public health students is to explore various populations and avenues for public health. There are so many job opportunities available with a range of populations that need your help! Keep an open mind to what is out there! Additionally, when you are hired make sure to network and utilize all the resources that your company provides!
