APSU Professional Spotlight : Sabrina Marsh

Hello Governors! My name is Sabrina Marsh, and I am a Healthcare Navigator for Centerstone's Support Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) grant funded by the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs. I'm an APSU alumni and former Instructor for the HHP Department. Our program's overall focus is to increase the stabilization and attainment of housing for low income and homeless Veterans in TN, KY, and IL. As case managers typically are the first line of defense in servicing this special population, they aid in all things related to housing. As a team, we provide outreach, case management, connection to VA benefits and programs, connection to public benefits and mainstream community resources, as well as Temporary Financial Assistance (TFA). If clients have healthcare needs and questions, they are then referred to me for assistance. The services I provide, as a resource person, can range from helping clients with VA disability compensation claims to acquiring reliable information regarding healthy eating habits. In addition to aiding my clients, I also am able to work in the community to identify resources and prospective partnerships. I would strongly advise students to join service-learning organizations, like Eta Sigma Gamma, to garner experience in the field before graduation. My application often stuck out due to my leadership experience in ESG, a national public health honorary, and the Health Promotion Committee on campus. Employers like to see you had a genuine interest in the field before graduating!
