## *CONSERVATION LETTER, Joe Schiller*

Last week I read the first article published by a respected authority on the subject that the long-predicted global peak oil has arrived. The article titled "Steep decline in oil production brings risk of war and unrest, says new study" by Ashley Seager appeared in the British newspaper the Gaurdian. The article summarizing a study published by A German organization called Energy Watch Group was authored by Joerg Schindler.

While it awaits other analysis to confirm these results, if they are true, the implications for global energy prices, economy, and security are profound. More startling was the conclusion of the authors that not only has the peak already occurred, but that a steep decline of 7% per year is likely to ensue. Supplies of gas, coal, and uranium are predicted to follow a similar pattern sooner than predicted as well.

On a separate, but related topic, the deadline for submitting comments to OSM on the proposed change to the 100 foot Stream Buffer Zone Rule has been extended to November 22. If you have not yet submitted comments, please see last

month's newsletter for information about the proposed rule change and how to submit comments.
