

Deans Council Notes
March 3, 2004

1. Harriett McQueen conducted a presentation on the first year experience course.
2. It was determined that the course will require 50 instructors. Harriett will hold recruiting sessions and there will be a 10 week course for instructors. The course will be a degree requirement for all first time freshmen.
3. Beulah discussed “Emerging Legal Trends on Campus” in an effort to address student complaints surrounding faculty members not following policies.
4. There are some 219 students who are registered with Disability Services on campus. Registration requires a student to complete and submit a student verification form to Disability Services.
5. April is disability awareness month. One of the programs will include a faculty Q and A session on April 15 & 16.
6. Beulah will be presenting a Tech. proposal before the Tech. Board outlining the need for software programs for disabled students.
7. Other items discussed during the meeting include a discussion about a standing committee that is really an advisory committee; registration at Fort Campbell and recommendations for the Dean of Arts and Letters by Dr. Speck.
