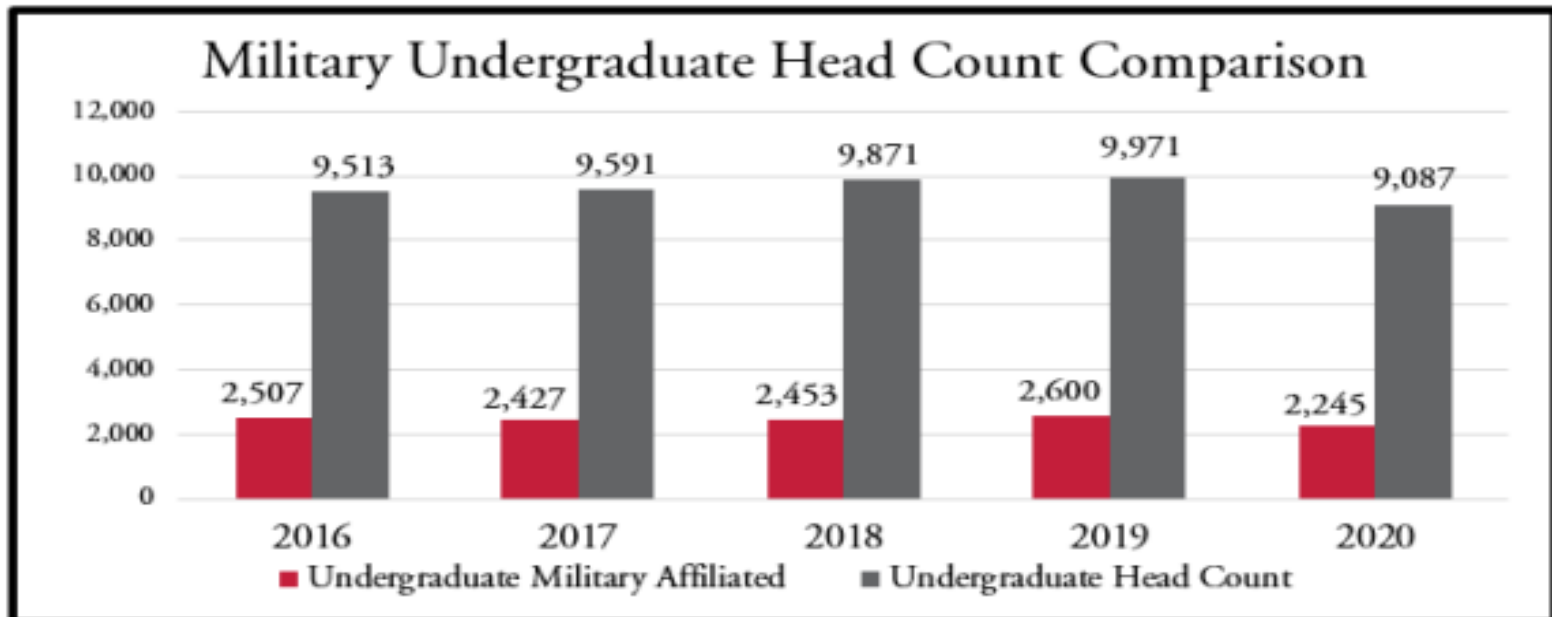

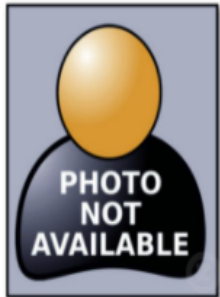

- All faculty must agree on credit allocation
- Vocational / lower / upper / graduate level credit

MIL/VET advising best practices:

- Know your student's affiliation
 - Active Military
 - May only be able to do online
 - Training/deploying soon?
 - May not be successful with typical student load (15 CH)
 - Balance work/school/home life
 - Last JST submission? Any promotions/schools? Submit new one
- National Guard and Reserve:
 - Typically train during summer months
 - Avoid taking a Friday class due to monthly drill weekends
 - Same JST questions

Best Practices Cont'd

- RET/VET
 - Typically using Veterans Education Benefits
 - Green Zone Training
 - Evaluate MIL credit to ensure proper allocations
 - Transfer credit?
 - Many have multiple transcripts
 - Update bulletin to use any language credits
 - Credits that meet spirit of general education?
 - Submit for chair review
 - Need one ground class to earn full housing allowance: about \$500/month
 - Integrate general education courses with degree requirements

What questions should you ask?

- 1) How many hours do you want to take in Fall 2021?
 - 16 week calendar or 8 week calendar
 - (2 Classes is considered full time for 8-wk courses)
- 2) Do you have a list of courses that you would like this term?
 - Taking core requirements to figure out bachelor's pursuit?
 - Math, Science, Behavioral selections critical
- 3) Are you an online course only student? Or combine ground/online options? Day or evening courses needed?
- 4) Do you work? If so, how many hours weekly?
 - Work/home/school balance
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More Questions:

- 5) Are you currently in the US military (Army/Navy/ED or other TA benefit)?
 - - If yes, any long term training events/deployments this term?
 - Must enroll NLT 4 business days prior to start of term (Army)
- 6) Are you in Army ROTC?
 - Needs ground classes; MSL courses set times
- 7) Are you using Post-911 or VA Vocational Rehab Benefits?
 - Must have one “ground” class per term for full housing allowance
- 9) Anything else to be communicated?
