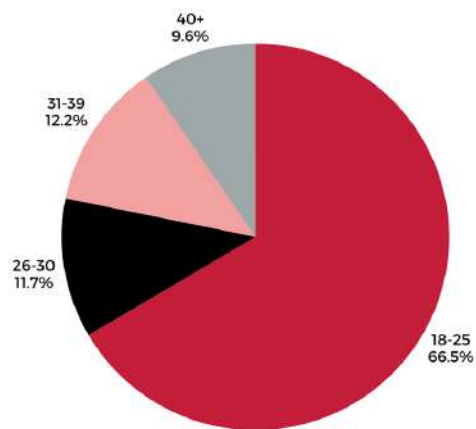

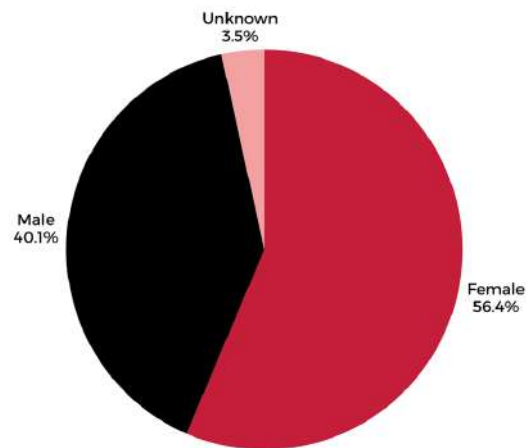

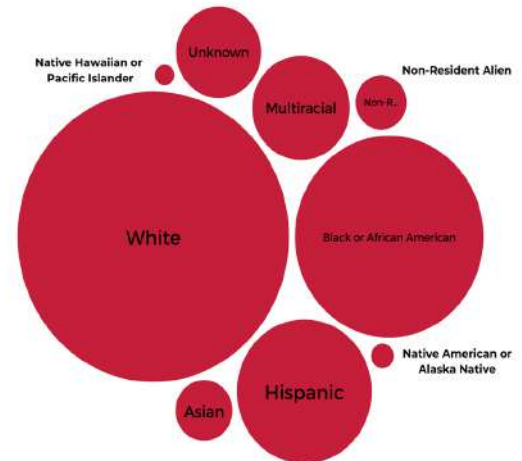
Undergraduate Student

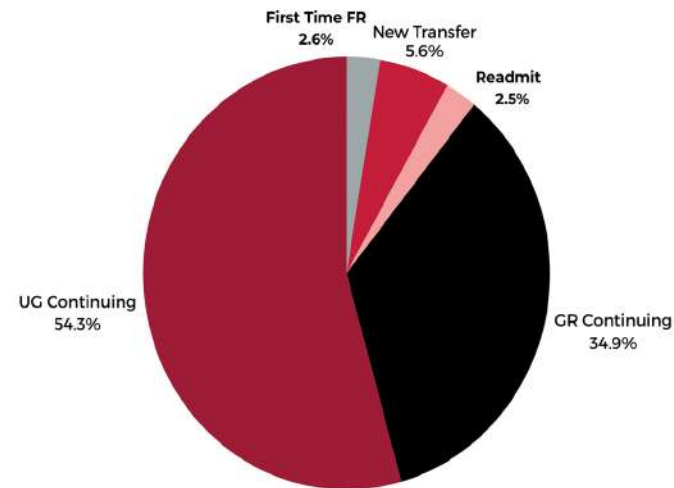

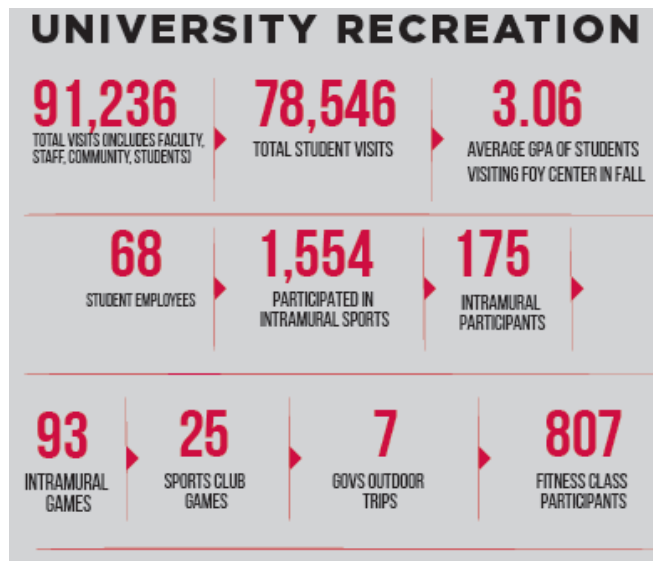

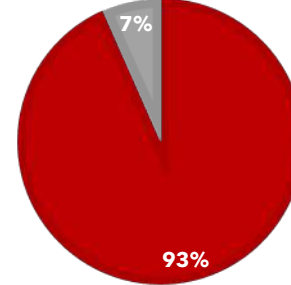

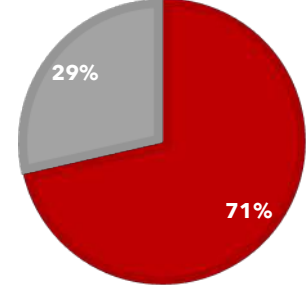

The number of business days between when CCS receives a report and when a decision or outcome is issued.

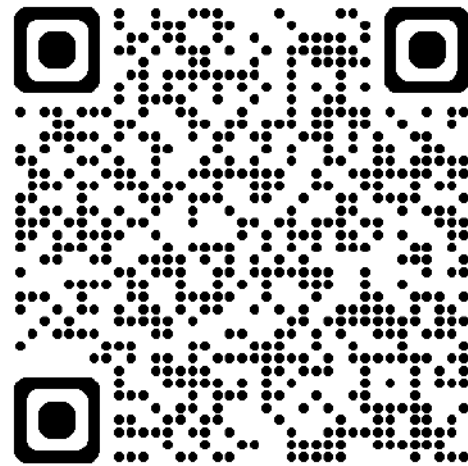
