Policy 2:032 Program Accreditation

Policy Statement

 "It is the policy of Austin Peay State University to adhere to required accreditation standards and to accurately represent itself to all accrediting agencies recognized by the U.S. Department of Education."

Purpose

"This policy establishes responsibility for specialized program
 accreditation and licensing as required for selected academic programs at
 Austin Peay State University."



Policy 2:032 Highlights

Specific Roles and Expectations coming later in this presentation.

ALL programs that are accreditable are required to seek or maintain accreditation due to Tennessee Higher Education Commission (THEC) guidelines.

- Compliance here is a factor in the QAF formula and affects our funding
- All other programs go through systematic Program Review
- A program is defined as accreditable if there is a recognized national agency which accredits programs for that field and degree level.
- Concentrations do NOT have to be accredited.



Policy 2:032 Highlights

SACSCOC requires consistency, accuracy, and timeliness

SACSCOC Standard 14.4 requires that APSU
 represents itself accurately to all U.S. Department of Education
 recognized accrediting agencies with which it holds accreditation
 AND

informs those agencies of any change of accreditation status, including the imposition of public sanctions.

 The SACSCOC Policy Statement on "Accrediting Decisions of Other Agencies" states that we must
 keep each [accrediting] agency apprised of any change in its status with one or another agency

AND that we must

represent [ourselves] accurately to each agency with regard to purpose, governance, programs, degrees, diplomas...

THEC Requirements

THEC requires that all non-accreditable programs undergo either an academic audit or external peer review according to a preapproved review cycle.

- Our Program Review model adheres to this requirement.
- In 2018-19, APSU changed from Academic Audit to Program Review

Programs are evaluated by an external reviewer using the Program Review Rubric, which can be found on the APSU <u>Quality Assurance Webpage</u>.

Evidence for the review is provided through a self-study report created by the program and a one-day site visit.

Roles and Responsibilities

Academic Affairs

- DSIR, IEA, and the Office of the Provost
 - Support data gathering
 - Support assessment strategies
 - Provide boiler-plate language
 - Review self-studies
 - Assist with site visit logistics
 - Store accreditor correspondence
 - Maintain list of accredited programs and those on the program review cycle
 - Support next steps after reviews
 - Report to THEC and SACSCOC

Program Leadership

- Dean, Chair, and other Program Leaders
 - Create a culture of continuous improvement
 - Draft the self-study
 - Send drafts to Provost's Office or IEA for editing support and review
 - Correspond with accreditor and/or external reviewer
 - Share accreditor correspondence with Provost's Office
 - Brief the President and Provost before accreditation site visits
 - Maintain compliance



IE ASSESSMENT

Your hard work can serve multiple purposes!

IE supports accreditation & review

- Program Accreditation
 - All accreditors have assessment standard(s)
 - Assessment may be named or presented differently, but there is overlap
 - IE process and accreditation
 can and should work
 together
 - Assessment data collected for accreditation *can and should* be used for IE

- Program Review
 - Focal Area 1 for program evaluation is Learning Outcomes (assessment) – 4 rubric items
 - Maintaining a high-quality, documented IE process each year will ensure programs easily meet these criteria in the review
