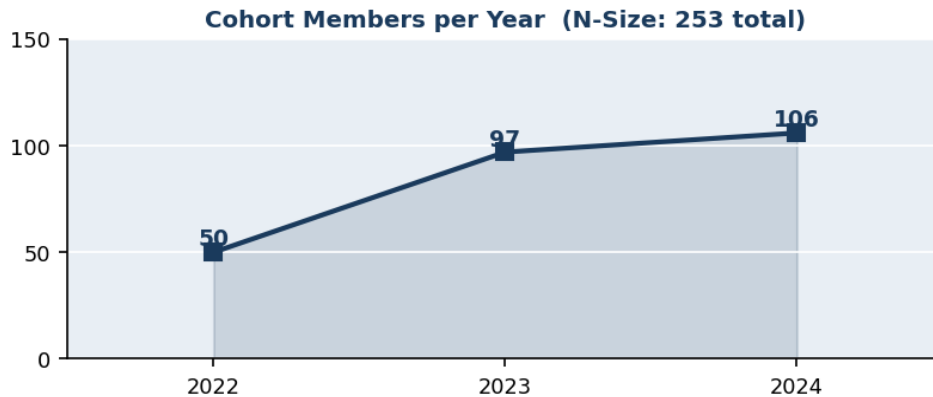

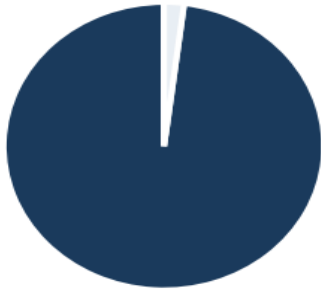
Cohort Enrollment Trend (2022-2024)

The three-year cohort includes 253 total members across the 2022, 2023, and 2024 reporting years. Enrollment has grown steadily over this period.

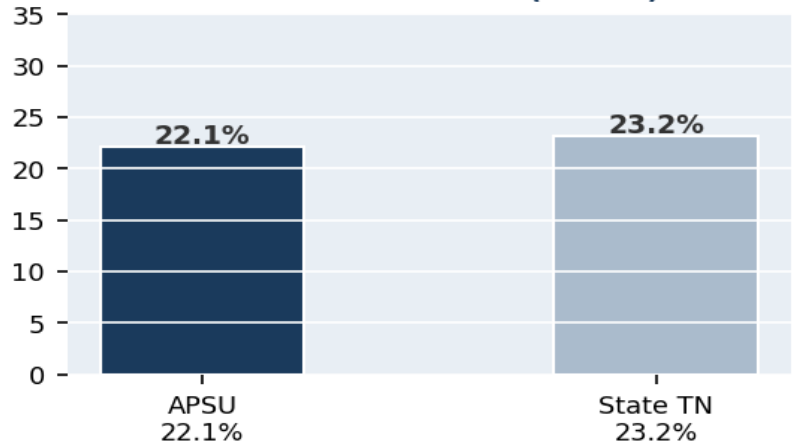

Praxis Leader Licensure Pass Rate (N=199)



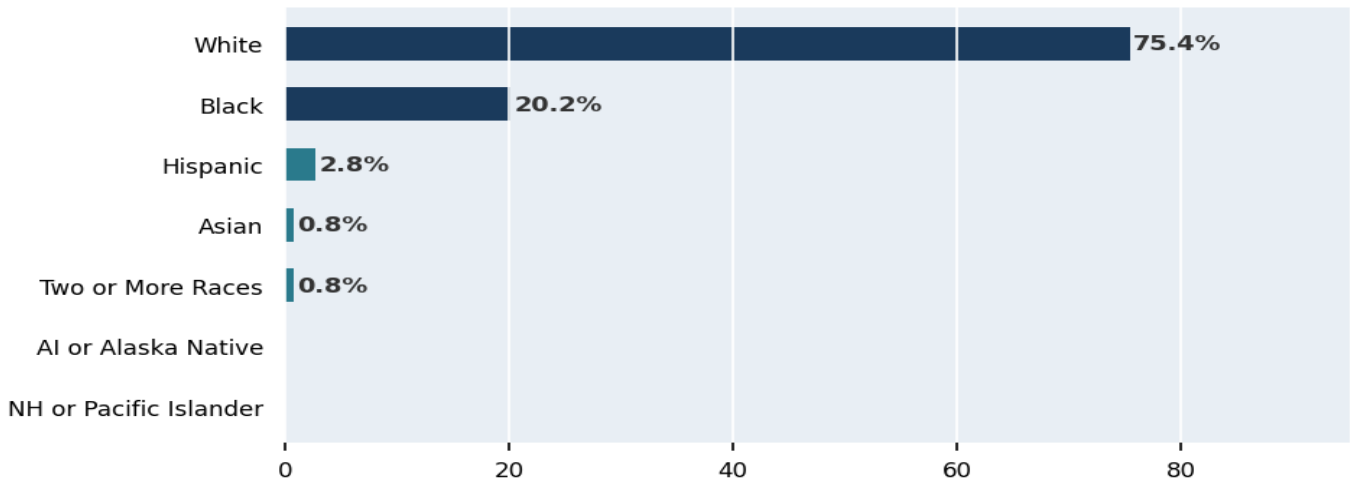
