General Information

The Tennessee Governor's Schools offer Tennessee high school students intensive learning experiences virtually or on postsecondary campuses. Each school system is encouraged to share the Governor's School information and applications with strong students who meet the criteria listed below. Nominations for the Tennessee Governor's Schools must be made by high school educators who can speak to the student's potential for success in the program. Each Governor's School convenes an application review committee to select the students invited to attend each school.

Governor's School for Computational Physics Austin Peay State University June 8 - June 27, 2025

Description: At the Governor's School for Computational Physics, you will earn four hours of college level credit during three intensive weeks. The coursework will provide you with a rigorous introduction to the computational methods used by scientists and engineers and will cover selected topics in calculus and vector analysis, numerical differentiation and integration, and computational solutions to differential equations. You will develop computational models of physical systems and experimentally test them. Introductory machine learning and artificial intelligence techniques will also be covered. In addition, you will learn more about career options in science and engineering through discussions with scientists and research engineers from facilities such as the National Space Science Technology Center, Oak Ridge National Laboratories, and others.

Courses:

PHYS 2500/2501 - Introduction to Computational Science & Engineering (and lab) Credit Hours: 3 lecture/1 lab

An introduction to the application of computational solutions to problems in physics and engineering. Includes an introduction to topics in first-year physics, algorithm development, and basic scientific programming skills. Focus is on computational solutions to differential equations (initial and boundary value problems) and their application to physical problems. Physical models will be developed and experimentally tested.

Objective:

Students will develop a basic understanding of computational techniques as a fundamental branch of science and engineering.

Prerequisites: Students applying for the School for Computational Physics must have completed or be scheduled to complete a course in pre-calculus (including trigonometry) prior to the beginning of the program and have an overall GPA of 3.5 or higher.

Application deadline: Friday, December 6, 2024

Submitting the Application:

Nominating educators should electronically submit completed applications following directions provided by the respective Governor's School(s). Applications submitted directly by students will **not** be accepted. The student may keep a copy of the application, excluding the confidential *Teacher Reference* forms and the confidential *Counselor/Administrator Verification* form; the nominating educator should keep one complete copy of the submitted application package.

Application Submission Instructions

Ensure applications are complete, arranged in the correct order (listed in the box below), and contain all required signatures and documents as outlined.

- 1. Nominating educators (usually the counselor) must submit applications via email (qovernorsschool@apsu.edu) no later than the deadline listed on page 2.
- 2. Each Governor's School has specific essay and writing sample questions. All questions must be answered and submitted with the application packet.
- COUNSELOR or ADMINISTRATOR: GPA, numerical test scores, focus elective, etc., must be included, if available. Please note that PSAT, SAT, and ACT scores are not mandatory, but school administrators are strongly encouraged to include this information if available. FOR GSCP, MATH SCORES ARE REQUESTED.
- 4. Students are to provide two teachers' names to counselor (see school-specific list on page 9) to complete the confidential *Teacher's Reference* forms. The completed reference forms should be returned directly to the counselor. The deadline to return the recommendation is up to the counselor (as long as the entire packet is received by the program by the deadline on page 2).
- 5. An official transcript must be included in the application packet.
- 6. Please do not include photos or resumes.
- 7. Notifications will be emailed to students on February 28, 2025.
