Pre-Interview Questions for the MHA program

1. What interests you about our program at Austin Peay University?

What I find most interesting about the MHA degree program at Austin Peay University is that it appears to be a business degree, but with a healthcare focus. This could provide a great deal more flexibility than a standard MBA or MSM. I'm very excited about the opportunity to gain knowledge in data analytics, management, financial planning, law, and human resources while building an understanding of how these business concepts are utilized in healthcare delivery.

Interaction with my online instructors has always been positive and rewarding with open and prompt communication.

My first concern about this program was the on-campus requirement for the MHA 5020 course. However, I reached out to the instructor, and she immediately put my fears to rest by explaining that the class only requires 1.75 days on campus split between two weekends. As this time allows me to meet with the other students in the cohort, and hear from industry representatives, I now see this "residency" as a valuable opportunity.

I still maintain correspondence with several of my former instructors and classmates. In 2022, I received the Outstanding Student Award in Leadership Science from APSU. Probity Award which is granted through nominations made by the faculty and staff. It is my hope that my peers and former teachers would say that I am diligent, organized, easy to work with, and always give my best effort in any endeavor.
