We've been building something new for our students!

Starting in Summer 2022, Dr. David Earnest and Dr. Adriane Sanders started partnering with organizations to provide consulting services that benefit the organization as well as provide applied research and consulting experiences to our MSIO students. The most recent project occurred this past summer, with 4 MSIO students consulting with Louisville Metro Government (LMG). MSIO alum, Austin Chitwood (class of '18), is Director of Workforce Development as part of a \$5 million, 5-year CDC grant for LMG's Dept of Public Health and Wellness. Hayden Plymel, Emily Reese, Bodie Schieffer, and Grace Kim developed the business case and strategy to implement a Performance Management System as well as extracting and operationalizing constructs from the Surgeon General's Workplace Mental Health and Well-being guidance that can be used in developing a LMG-wide org culture of health and wellbeing.

Pioneering the Skies and Classrooms

Dr. David Earnest and Dr. Kevin Harris are in the early stages of an exciting aviation project at APSU, collaborating with faculty from both the Aviation and Computer Science departments. Drawing from classic I-O and Cognitive Psyc research in selection and expert performance, the research team is aiming to develop measures to predict aviation student success in the aviation program and ultimately as pilots. MSIO students are actively involved from project design to grant writing and conducting the study. While the project will proceed without external funding, a successful grant application could secure a \$6 million, 5-year grant from the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). This innovative project is potentially a win-win for both APSU and its students, offering hands-on research experience and potentially revolutionizing educational metrics.

MSIO faculty continues to engage students & community

Dr. Chanda Murphy continues to involve MSIO students throughout each stage of a long-running project to develop a mindfulness-based social-emotional learning app for K12 students. In the earliest stages, MSIO alum Nancy Temple (class of '22), worked with Dr. Murphy on initial literature reviews and project planning. For the past academic year, current MSIO students, Kaytah Meija and Hayden Plymel, conducted the qualitative analysis from a pilot study of Moshi Kids that has been used for presenting to Mind Candy execs, and their written reports will be featured on the Moshi Kids website and submitted for publication by the end of this year.

As lead researcher on implementing the app in PreK-3rd grade in the U.S., Dr. Murphy in partnership with Moshi Kids and the American Institute for Research (AIR) just finished applying for a \$4 million, 5-year Education in Research Grant through the Department of Education. If awarded, the app will be implemented in approximately 72 classrooms and provide social-emotional learning for approximately 900 students and their families in pre-K Head Start programs in both Muskegon, MI, and Clarksville, TN. The grant also includes funding for 2 MSIO students, which will enable them to work with the research firm and Moshi organization. Grant awards will be announced at the earliest this October.
