What do most graduate applications require?

- 1. Unofficial and/or official transcripts from any previously attended institution.
- 2. GRE scores
- 3. Curriculum vitae (CV)
- 4. Personal statement
- 5. Cover Letter
- 6. Letter(s) of recommendation
- 7. Application fee

Transcripts

- Most programs will require that you send in unofficial transcripts from every university and college you have previously attended
- If you are accepted, you will be required to send in official transcripts after you have graduated.
- You might be required to pay a small fee to obtain these documents

GRE Scores

- ETS
- Some schools will ask that you provide GRE scores.
- The GRE General Test is an exam that covers three different areas: verbal reasoning, quantitative reasoning, and analytical writing.
- Typically costs around \$200
- Scores can be used for up to five years

- Takes 10-15 days for scores to be sent to institutions of your choice-schedule accordingly!

CV (Curriculum Vitae)

- Academic resume
- Will include what you studied, organizations you joined, awards and scholarships received, and any other important information that pertains to your coursework.
- Will include academic references
- Consult your advisor or a professor in a relevant field for major-specific information to include.

Personal Statement

- This is where you get to really show off!
- You can go into more detail about what's listed on your CV.
- Typically no more than 2-3 pages.
- Consider: What do I enjoy the most about my field? What are my future plans?
 What makes me unique from other students? How can I be an asset to the department I'm applying to?

Cover Letter

- Aim for no more than one page
- Have a personalized greeting
- Take pride in your past accomplishments and explain why you are a perfect fit for the job!
- Make sure to use professional language

Letter(s) of Recommendation

- Most graduate programs will ask that your provide a certain number of letters of recommendation.
- A good rule of thumb is to ask professors who you've either had: a.) at least two classes with, and/or b.) is your advisor
- Many universities will let you send a request through their system to your professors; make sure to politely ask beforehand!
- Generally, you will not get to see what the professor wrote about you.

Application Fee

- Most programs will ask that you pay an application processing fee.
- For example: APSU's is \$45 for domestic students, \$55 for international
- Some universities have fee waivers available.
- Some applications will require that you pay the fee before you can upload any documents.

Important Things to Remember...

- The more competitive your field is, the more schools you should apply to.
- Make sure to get a good mix of schools; don't just shoot for the most prestigious you can attain.
- Have a backup plan
- Make sure to research schools that will be a good fit for you, not just what looks good on a resume!
