 - Example: Lauren Ober, host, *The Loudest Girl in the World*, season 1, episode 2, "Goodbye, Routine; Hello, Meltdown!," Pushkin Industries, September 13, 2022, 41 min., 37 sec., https://www.pushkin.fm/podcasts/loudest-girl-in-the-world.
- Shortened note: Last Name, "Shortened Title," time reference if applicable.
 - Example: Ober, "Goodbye, Routine."
- **Bibliography entry:** Host Last Name, First Name, host. *Podcast Title*. Season #, episode #, "Episode Title." Publisher, Month Day, Year. Podcast, duration (min., sec.). URL.
