Thesis or Dissertation

- **Notes and Bibliography Style:**

- **Note:** First Name Last Name, “Title of Thesis or Dissertation” (Degree, University, Year), page(s), Database or Archive (Identifier if applicable).

- **Example:** Yuna Blajer de la Garza, “A House Is Not a Home: Citizenship and Belonging in Contemporary Democracies” (PhD diss., University of Chicago, 2019), 66–67, ProQuest (13865986).

- **Shortened note:** Last Name, “Shortened Title,” page(s).

- **Example:** Blajer de la Garza, “House,” 93.

- **Bibliography entry:** Last Name, First Name. “Title of Thesis or Dissertation.” Degree, University, Year. Database or Archive (Identifier if applicable).

- **Example:** Blajer de la Garza, Yuna. “A House Is Not a Home: Citizenship and Belonging in Contemporary Democracies.” PhD diss., University of Chicago, 2019. ProQuest (13865986).

- **Author-Date Style:**

- **In-text Citation:** (Author Last Name Year, Page Numbers)

- **Example:** (Blajer de la Garza 2019, 66–67)

- **Reference List:** Author Last Name, First Name. Year. “Title of Dissertation.” PhD diss. or MA thesis, Name of University. Database Name (Identification Number if applicable).

- **Example:** Blajer de la Garza, Yuna. 2019. “A House Is Not a Home: Citizenship and Belonging in Contemporary Democracies.” PhD diss., University of Chicago. ProQuest (13865986).
