### Search Tips for Databases

#### Search Tips for Databases

The first thing you want to do is **decide your topic**.

- Start broad! Pick the subject of what you want to write about, then break it into search terms such as:
  - “Coffee Industry in the U.S. and How It’s Impacted the Environment” → “Coffee Industry AND United States”
- Now that you have your topic, you can find an article in the library Databases. Go to our library website (Felix G. Woodward Library (<https://library.apsu.edu/>)
  - Under “Search and Find”, select “Databases”
  - Then, use the “Subjects” tab to select the subject of your topic. Select the closest subject relating to your topic.
  - After that, I searched for “Environmental Studies” in the search bar to keep it broad and find the best databases related to my topic. I chose **Gale Environmental Studies and Policy**
- **JSTOR** (<https://www.jstor.org/>) and **Gale** (<https://www.gale.com/>) are great options for just about any topic or subject.
