American Institute of Physics (AIP) 4th Edition Handout

In-text Citations

Use numbered citations in square brackets: [1], [2]

Number sources in order of appearance

Place citations inside punctuation

Reuse the same number for repeat sources

Example:

The energy efficiency results were presented at the symposium [1].

References List

List references in numerical order

Match numbers to in-text citations

The word “in” before the conference name is not in italics

End entries with a period (except DOI/URL)

If there is no author, start with the title

Use hanging indents: first line flush left, all subsequent lines indented by 0.5 inch

Reference Example:

[1] C. Yaakov and R. Huque, in *Second International Telecommunications Energy Symposium '97*, Copenhagen, Denmark, 1997, pp. 17-27.

AIP Style - Citing Symposia and Conferences

In-Text Citation Format: [number]

Sentence with In-Text Citation Example: This concept is explained in detail [1].

Symposium or Conference Article

Reference Format:

[] INITIAL(S). Surname, in *Conference Title*, Location, Year, pp. Starting–Ending page.

- Use “in” before the conference or symposium title.

Reference Example:

[1] C. Yaakov and R. Huque, in *Second International Telecommunications Energy Symposium '97*, Copenhagen, Denmark, 1997, pp. 17-27.

Edited Proceedings with Publisher Information

Reference Format:

[] INITIAL(S). Surname, *Proceedings Title*, edited by Editor(s) (Publisher, Place, Year), pp. Starting–Ending page.

- Include “edited by” followed by editor names.
- Publisher and location go in parentheses.
- Include page range with “pp.”

Reference Example:

[1] C. Yaakov and R. Huque, *Second International Telecommunications Energy Symposium Proceedings*, edited by E. Yow (IEEE, New York, 1996), pp. 17-27.

Edited Conference Proceedings, Published Under a Separate Title

Reference Format:

[] INITIAL(S). Surname, in *Conference Title*, Proceedings of the Full Conference Name, Location, Year, edited by Editor(s), Series/Number (Publisher, Place, Year).

Reference Example:

[1] C. Yaakov and R. Huque, in *Telecommunications Energy International*, Proceedings of the 2nd International Telecommunications Energy Conference, Copenhagen, 1997, edited by J. Choi, J-Y. Yang, and J. Sinogeikina, AIP. Conf. Proc. No. 42 (AIP, New York, 1997).

Published proceedings from a meeting/conference

Reference Format:

[] INITIAL(S). Surname, *Proceedings of the Full Conference Name*, Location, Publisher Number (Publisher, Place, Year), pp. Starting–Ending page.

- Why no “in”? These proceedings are already published as a standalone volume.

Reference Example:

[1] C. Yaakov and R. Huque, *Proceedings of the Second International Telecommunications Energy Conference*, Copenhagen, IEEE Pub. No. 320CMORE2-75 (IEEE, New York, 1997), pp. 17-27.

Conference Proceedings to Be Published in Another Journal

Reference Format:

[] INITIAL(S). Surname, in *Proceedings of the Conference Title*, Location, Year [Journal Abbreviation (to be published)].

Reference Example:

[1] C. Yaakov and R. Huque, in *Proceedings of the Second International Telecommunications Energy Conference*, Copenhagen, 1997 [J. Phys. Rev (to be published)].
