Writing Argumentative Paragraphs: The SEE Method

The SEE method (Statement, Evidence, Explanation) is a structured approach to writing strong argumentative paragraphs. It helps ensure your writing is clear, well-supported, and logically connected.

S - Statement

- Make a clear claim or argument that sets the focus of the paragraph.
 - **Example:** Campus resources are essential for student success, providing academic, personal, and professional support throughout college.

E - Evidence

- Provide research or factual information to support the statement.
 - Can include statistics, quotes, studies, or examples.
 - **Example:** "Studies show that students who use campus resources like tutoring, career services, and counseling are more likely to earn higher grades, secure internships, and maintain well-being (Smith, 2025)."

E - Explanation

- Analyze how the evidence supports by showing the relevance and connection to the statement.
 - **Example:** Campus resources play a crucial role in helping students overcome academic challenges, plan for their futures, and maintain a balanced college experience. By taking advantage of these services, students set themselves up for long-term success.
