#### Instructor Notes or Class Handouts

**Basic Format:** Instructor's Last Name, First Name. "Title of Handouts/Notes." Name of Course, University Name. Date handout was received. Course handout.

#### Examples

Greenberg, Nora. "Literary Terms." English 103, Capilano University. Received 10 Feb. 2020.  
Course handout.

Smith, John. "Introduction to Sociology Lecture Notes." SOC 101, Austin Peay State University,  
15 March 2023. Class Notes.

#### In-Text Citations

**Parenthetical Format:** (Instructor's Last Name)

- **Example:** (Greenberg)

**Narrative Format:** Instructor's name appears in the sentence.

- **Example:** Greenberg explained in their lecture that writing is essential.

#### Instructor Presentation Slides (e.g. PowerPoint)

**Basic Format:** Instructor's Last Name, First Name. "Title of PowerPoint Presentation." Title of Course, Date of PowerPoint presentation, University Name. Microsoft PowerPoint presentation.

#### Examples

Actis, Andrea. "Week 2: The Politics of Care." English 110, 15 Jan. 2019, Capilano University.  
Microsoft PowerPoint presentation.

Paulson, Paul. "ANTH 110: Week 2: The Nature of Culture." *Introductory Anthropology I*,  
Columbia College, 15 Jan. 2016. Microsoft PowerPoint presentation.

Smith, John. "Introduction to Psychology." *PSY 101*, Austin Peay State University, 10 Sept.  
2023. Microsoft PowerPoint presentation.

### **In-Text Citations**

If your instructor prefers, include the slide number; if not, leave it out.

**Parenthetical Format:** (Instructor's Last Name)

- **Example:** (Actis, slide 5)

**Narrative Format:** Instructor's name appears in the sentence.

- **Example:** Actics explained in their presentation, on slide 5, that science is the way of life.

### **Class Lecture Heard in Person**

**Basic Format:** Instructor's Last Name, First Name. "Title of Lecture." Title of Course, Date of lecture, University Name. Lecture.

### **Examples**

Johnston, Allie. "Introduction to English Composition." *ENGL 1010*, Austin Peay State  
University, 15 Mar. 2023. Lecture.

Bankes, Megan. "The Nature of Culture." Anthropology 110, 15 Jan. 2010. Capilano University.  
Lecture.

**Parenthetical Format:** (Instructor's Last Name)

**Narrative Format:** Instructor's name appears in the sentence.

- **Example:** Johnston explained in their lecture that writing is essential.
